This month, Program Directors will participate in a 3-day Safety-Care Trainer Training at Lebanon City Schools.

Safety-Care is a training curriculum for staff that is designed to provide a set of strategies for safely and humanely providing support to individuals who may sometimes exhibit disruptive or dangerous behavior.

Techniques for incident prevention include teaching staff how to structure a supportive and safe environment, using appropriate and everyday safety habits, and how to effectively provide reinforcement. To help minimize incidents, staff are trained how to use de-escalation procedures.

After successfully completing this training, Program Directors will be certified trainers, and train Abilities First staff in Safety-Care during the summer months. April begins our monthly newsletters! These newsletters will include updates, reminders of upcoming events, fun activities to do at home, and other important information. Rainbow Bubble Foam

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup water per color
- 2-3 tbsp Tear-Free Soap.
- 4 drops Food Coloring

INSTRUCTIONS

- Use a hand mixer or standing mixer. Mix 1 cup of water with your desired food color shade.
- Add in tear-free soap & start mixing the ingredients together.
- The longer that you mix the bubble foam recipe, the more foam bubbles will form.
- The end result should have all the liquid out of the bowl and the bubble foam should look very similar to the image. Light, fluffy, and vibrant.
- Repeat the process with all of the colors that you've chosen and then have your kiddo make a bubble foam rainbow just like the one shown.
